DRAFT Straw Proposal for CTR Program new state targets

December 1, 2022

Straw Proposal

WSDOT staff proposes to the TDM Technical Committee to replace current CTR program's state targets (of an 18% reduction in vehicle miles traveled (VMT) and a 6% point increase in non-drive-alone-travel (NDAT)) with state targets as follows:

- > 2023-2025 No state targets. Gather new commute data.
- 2025-2027 Make progress. Reduce vehicle miles traveled and increase non-drive alone trips from 2023-2025 commute data.

Note: Jurisdictions would still have two options for use in their plans: 1. state targets, 2. local targets. Local targets require review and approval by the TDM Technical Committee.

Why WSDOT is providing this recommendation?

The world has changed and the new normal is still a work in progress. We have seen increases in telework and hybrid work and shifts in times and locations of traffic congestion. This approach to state targets creates a path to adapt to and improve on these changes.
