

Interim Guidance: CTR-affected Designation for Cities

Purpose

The purpose of this document is to provide interim guidance on how cities will be designated Commute Trip Reduction (CTR)-affected, or lose their CTR-affected designation, for the next couple of years. This interim guidance will be used until the Commute Trip Reduction-affected Designation for Cities project more formally updates policies and practices.

Background

A city becomes CTR-affected when it meets three criteria:

- location in an urban growth area (UGA)
- presence of a major employer worksite
- one hundred person hours of delay for a highway segment

Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) staff and other CTR implementers are not able to apply these criteria because:

- Although the Washington Administrative Code (WAC) designates a list of UGAs as CTRaffected, status may have changed for some cities over time.
- We can no longer use the "one hundred person hours of delay for a highway segment" criterion to assess a city's CTR-affected status, because WSDOT no longer collects these data.

Implementers and prospective implementers are requesting WSDOT provide guidance.

Guidance

No action is required of implementers or potential implementers at this time. The project will not affect the current 2025-2029 CTR plan cycle. Cities that are designated CTR-affected in WAC but do not meet the UGA or major employer worksite criteria will not be considered CTR-affected. If CTR-affected cities are identified that are not currently in the CTR program, the next opportunity for newly CTR-affected cities to write CTR plans will be in 2027-2029, for the 2029-2033 plan cycle. In mid-2025 WSDOT will communicate a new method for determining CTR-affected status and a new list of CTR-affected cities.

Notes

- The TDM Technical Committee may amend this process, upon recommendation from WSDOT staff.
- This project's recommendations may prompt an evaluation of the CTR budget.
