Meeting convened at 10:02 AM by Marshall Elizer.

Welcome and announcements – Marshall Elizer

Marshall welcomed the committee, implementers and partners. Marshall announced that <u>early bird registration</u> is now open for the Washington State Ridesharing Organization (WSRO) conference ("How a Great City Moves," Spokane, Sep. 29 – Oct. 1, 2024). Olivia Kahn shared that WSRO has released a <u>call for presenters</u>.

Patrick announced that Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) has completed its Transportation Planning Specialist (TPS) 4 hire: Wren Barulich, who has experience in both the consulting and nonprofit sectors (including Commute Seattle), will start April 16. Recruitment for a TPS3 position is also underway.

Maya shared that WSDOT is in the procurement process for facilitation services for the joint retreat (Nov. 6-7, 2024) with Lisa Voight (of Eudaimonia Rising); she is formerly with King County Metro, and recommended by Carol Cooper.

Michael Villnave introduced Paul Muppidi, who will be replacing him as Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) representative.

Commute Seattle is seeking a new <u>Education and Events Specialist</u>. The person in this role will be part of a team that delivers transportation demand management (TDM) consulting services, events, marketing, and data collection/visualization for hundreds of the largest employers and properties in the City of Seattle. CTR 4-year plan milestone minutes – Stan Suchan, Carol Thompson WSDOT created a <u>tracking sheet</u> for required milestones and demonstrated progress on CTR 4-year plans. Carol Thompson is in discussion with jurisdiction implementers regarding updates.

Grant administration – Laura Moxham

Laura shared that this is a new body of work for the TDM team. TDM-related grants formerly overseen by community transportation planners (who used to be known as community liaisons) have transitioned to the TDM team this past week. In addition, CTR grant administration and Public Transportation (PT) Rideshare will transition to the TDM team.

Patrick and Laura are currently managing this work. Patrick's responsibilities include seven CTR contracts including working with:

- City of Auburn
- City of Kent
- City of Redmond
- City of Woodinville
- King County Metro
- City of Everett
- TPRC

Laura's responsibilities include the nineteen remaining contracts. The new TPS4 will take over some contract management responsibilities. We are working closing to ensure continuity and consistency in how we are managing the contracts.

In the future, we are working to transition TDM-related regional mobility grants to the TDM team, and we anticipate this transition occurring by the end of June.

TDM workplan and Committee workplan – Stan Suchan

WSDOT assembled a <u>Gantt chart</u> explaining the general timeline for projects/ and tasks for the Tech committee and for implementers.

CTR Implementers' Open Floor – Implementers
