About the Transit Support Grant Program

- Provides state formula grant funding to support operating and capital expenses of transit agencies in Washington state.
- Funded entirely by Washington's Climate Commitment Act (i.e., 100 percent).
- All transit agencies in Washington eligible (except Sound Transit).

Program funding

- 2021-2023 supplemental (initial funding): \$33.6 million
- **2023-2025 biennium:** \$188.9 million



Program eligibility

- **Zero-fare-for-youth policy:** Adopt and implement a zero-fare policy for all modes provided by the agency, including paratransit, for people 18 and under.
- Local sales tax for transit: Maintain or increase local sales tax authority on or after Jan. 1, 2022, and may not delay or suspend the collection of voter-approved sales taxes approved on or before Jan. 1, 2022.
- Low-barrier accessibility: To the extent practicable, align implementation of youth zero-fare policies with equity and environmental justice principles consistent with recommendations from the environmental justice council, and ensure low-barrier accessibility of the program to all youth.



Eligible projects

Providing transit service

 Example: Provide specialized transportation service for veterans in Pacific Transit's service area to veterans' health facilities (Pacific Transit).

Vehicle/equipment purchases to support transit service.

 Example: Purchase one zero-emission bus and diagnostics and tools for the bus (Lewis County Transit).

Construction to support transit service

 Example: Working with community partners to turn an underperforming park and ride into a mixed-use affordable housing development (Whatcom Transit Authority).

Other transit-related projects (i.e., training, mobility management)

 Example: Planning for rapid transit in Bellingham and continued transition to a zero-emission fleet (Whatcom Transit Authority).



Results!

First three months of Transit Support Grant Program (October-December 2022):

- 6.9 million fare-free transit rides for youth 18 and under.
- 6.5 million rides for Transit Support Grant-funded projects.
