25-27 budget timeline

Late March: House and Senate had different budgets. (Multimodal Account (MMA) funds removed from program funding in House.) New taxes proposed.

Early April: Committee presentations and practitioner testimony

Mid-April: MMA funds reinstituted in House. Legislative negotiations reconciled budgets. Tax proposals refined.

Late-April: Budget proposed to the Governor for review.

Current: CTR funds do not increase or decrease. They are the same as last biennium.

Next: Governor signs the budget.

Revenue: package history


Pre-2003: Gas taxes, tolling, fees, registrations

- Gas tax decline
- Other fees increase
- Reliability shifts




Revenue: appropriations by

- Package intent varies
- Packages can expire, depending on their intent

Climate

Funds: MMA

Multimodal transportation account (MMA):

- **Source:** Vehicle excise tax, motor vehicle licenses, permits, and other fees.
- 2/3 of CTR funding
- Intent: Support system that could not be funded by gas tax.
- Eligible projects: Improve efficiency to transportation system.
- Examples: World Cup projects, vanpool vehicle replacement, rural transit programs

Flexible funding parameters



Funds: CERA

Carbon Emissions Reduction Account (CERA):

- **Source:** Carbon auction
- 1/3 of CTR funds
- Intent: Reduce impact of carbon and pollutants. Eligibility further refined by HEAL Act.
- Eligible projects: Measurably reduce carbon and pollutants.
- Examples: Transit electrification, bike infrastructure, bus passes for mode-shift

Budget: proposed

Budget is determined by appropriations.

Budget proviso: proposed

What is a proviso?

Directs spending of specific funds on priorities of the legislature.

(6) \$6,195,000 of the multimodal transportation account—state appropriation, \$3,300,000 of the climate transit programs account—state appropriation, and \$784,000 of the state vehicle parking account—state appropriation are provided solely for CTR grants and activities. Fuel type may not be a factor in the grant selection process. Of this amount, \$495,000 of the multimodal transportation account—state appropriation is reappropriated and provided solely for continuation of previously approved projects under the first mile/last mile connections grant program.

- Fluctuations + package purpose determine amounts
- Legislature determines distribution
- Funds categorized into accounts
- Budget specifies funding amounts
- Directed through proviso
