The formula is confirmed but the inputs will change

2025-2029 Grant Formula – Approved April 2025:

- Provide \$31,250 to each CTR-affected city and unincorporated area of a CTR-affected county (cities).
- Take remaining funding and distribute on a per worksite basis to cities with more than 5 worksites.
- Round totals to the nearest hundred.

Challenges this grant cycle

- The 2025-2027 biennium was the first time utilizing the new CTR Survey Tool to verify for worksite counts.
 - Worksite discrepancy requests were reviewed and approved.
- The timeline for determining award amounts overlap with timeline for completing surveys (June 30th deadline).
- Equivalent data collection and cleanup created delays in sharing what the final funded amount per jurisdiction would be via award letters.



Review: +/- Worksite Discrepancy

3-Step Process

Step 1: Review worksites counts in the survey tool starting in April.

Step 2: Gather documentation materials as needed and submit requests by Monday, June 2nd.

Step 3: WSDOT reviews materials and provides an explanation on what worksites will be counted towards a jurisdiction's funding formula within 2 weeks of submission.




How did this process go?

At-a-glance

- WSDOT received requests from 12 jurisdictions.
- Average request was 3 worksites
- Largest request was to review 50 worksites

All requests were approved if they met the following:

- If the worksite was not currently funded (meaning 1 or more response in the survey tool)
- 2. The jurisdiction provided documentation of the status of the worksite's relationship to the CTR program.



What we heard from grantees:

Delays in receiving the award letters due to worksite count volatility made programmatic planning was challenging. In some cases, created delays in contracting.




Adjusting the levers of process
