When it all **Started**.

Spokane Transit Vanpool was launched in 1983 with five vans.





Now in 2025, it is called Rideshare and we have 100 vehicles in the fleet.

What is *Rideshare?*

Rideshare is a public transit option for groups of commuters who share the same route and schedule.

Spokane Transit provides a small vehicle for the group to use.

Commuters pay a fixed monthly fare to join the program.

Spokane Transit covers the costs:

- Vehicle
- Fuel
- Insurance
- Maintenance





Riders get to *manage* their Rideshare

 Monthly fare is fixed regardless of vehicle type, passenger count, or mileage:

\$60 – Spokane County commutes

\$80 – Kootenai or Stevens County commutes

\$100 – Commutes to or from all other counties

Find the right fit for you!

- We have 4 different vehicle types and sizes
- Use commutefindernw.com to find a route near you

Routes can be dynamic.

- Connect across county and even state lines
- Door-to-door or use a convenient park and ride
- Riders are eligible for a *free* STA bus pass

By the *Numbers*

- 90 routes from northern Idaho, Grand Coulee, Pullman and Ritzville
- 38 individual employers benefit with reliable attendance and increased access to labor
- **108,00** trips expected for 2025
- **2.1 million** drive alone miles removed off our roads
- 90% of our employers provide some level of Rideshare subsidy





Spokane Transit's *Re-Invented* program

- 2020: STA instituted a simplified fare structure
 - 3 tiers based on the county the route begins or ends. All routes must either start or end in Spokane County.
- 2022: SUVs (Chevy Traverses) were introduced to the fleet.
- 2022: Vanpool was rebranded as Rideshare.
- 2024: Telematics was installed in all Rideshare vehicles.
- 2025 (now): the entire STA fleet is getting telematics installed due to the success of Rideshare.

Investing in **Sustainability**

Electric Vehicle Pilot

- Over a dozen groups will be selected for piloting a new EV fleet
- Selection was based on worksite charging stations and driver familiarity with EV vehicles





Invaluable *CTR* Partnership

We have teamed up with Commute Smart NW, Spokane County's CTR program, to bring STA Rideshare to local employers.

- We are integrated in their ETC training curriculum.
- CSNW has granted us access to their ETCs to bring promotions and awareness to area employees.
- We conduct joint promotions to increase ridership.
- CSNW has incentivized employers with points toward recognition awards to have Rideshare visit their worksite.
