Free Rides

A new seasonal shuttle connecting the stadium area, Seattle Center, downtown waterfront, Pioneer Square, Chinatown-International District and King Street Station.

ADDED TRIPS ON BUSY ROUTES

More trips on routes expected to see higher ridership, helping maintain service for regular riders.



METRO FLEX

More vehicles to support on-demand neighborhood connections and links to other transit services.



WATER TAXI

More sailings connecting with Vashon and West Seattle, paired with more trips on the West Seattle Shuttle.



ACCESSIBLE MATCH DAY SHUTTLE

Special accessible shuttle service on match days, connecting Link light rail, Mariners Garage, and the stadium to support riders with special mobility needs.

2 EASIER TRIPS FOR RIDERS



TAP TO PAY

Tap to pay with an ORCA card, contactless credit or debit card or mobile wallet on participating services at all doors open for boarding.



PUGET PASS

A convenient three-day ORCA pass option for visitors and residents making multiple trips across the region this summer.



TRANSIT INFORMATION

Clear signs and maps to help riders find their way more easily.



RIDER SUPPORT

Metro staff will help people find their way to the right transit option on busy event days.

3 PLAN AHEAD AND CONNECT



FLIP YOUR TRIP

Metro and the Seattle Department of Transportation are encouraging residents to shift trips away from driving alone and offering ORCA incentives to support those choices.



INCENTIVES TO CONNECT TO TRANSIT

Targeted incentives will help riders connect to park-and-rides and major transit hubs via bike, scooter or ride share.



COMMUNITY & PARTNER COORDINATION

Metro is working with regional agencies, employers, community organizations, and event partners to support a welcoming reliable travel experience.

BEHIND THE SCENES

Safety and security remain Metro's top priorities—every day, and especially during major events.
